

IT IS TIME TO REGISTER FOR HCJH!!!

Summer is flying by and plans are being made for an exciting school year in La Mirada! We hope that all is going well and that you are enjoying the summer months.

We are busily preparing for September and our enrollment is quickly moving forward. We will be ministering to approximately 240 students in the fall! In order to help you get ready for the first days of school, please read carefully the following information:

Registration Day: The day is **Monday, August 10, 2009, from 11:00 am until 7:00 pm**, at our campus. Please have the enclosed paper work filled out and ready to turn in on that day. If, for some reason, you cannot make it on the 10th, please **give us a call AFTER Registration Day** and set up a time to come in and bring your paperwork. We will not be able to take any Registration materials before August 10th.

Band, Jazzband, Choir and Handbell Tryouts: All new students who would like to be involved in these music programs need to participate in a short tryout. The Band, Choir and Handbell tryouts can be scheduled during the time that you come for Registration. PLEASE CALL THE OFFICE PRIOR TO REGISTRATION AND SCHEDULE YOUR TIME FOR TRYOUTS.

"New Family Orientation Night": Write it down...Tuesday night, September 8. Come and see the campus, meet the teachers, and get your locker! It will be a great time of beginnings and a commitment for the future. DON'T MISS IT! This is for all new students and their parents. There will be a dinner put on by the Cheerleaders at 5:30 pm., followed by the Orientation Program at 6:30 pm.

First Day of School: Wednesday, September 9, at 8:00 a.m. will be the start! **THIS WILL BE A FULL DAY OF SCHOOL... ENDING AT 3:00 PM.** Normal school hours will be 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Day Care will be available. **DUE TO THE HECTICNESS OF THE FIRST DAY, WE WOULD ASK THAT YOU DON'T PARK AND WALK YOUR STUDENT IN ON SEPTEMBER 9TH. WE HAVE A SPECIAL "NEW FAMILY ORIENTATION NIGHT" ON TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8TH THAT WILL HOPEFULLY ANSWER ALL OF YOUR QUESTIONS AND HELP YOUR STUDENT GET COMFORTABLE WITH SCHOOL.**

Traffic Issues and Bus Shuttles: We have some obvious concerns with the traffic as we come into the neighborhood. We are first and foremost concerned with the safety of our students! **We encourage carpools!** You will receive traffic updates along the way and we will be asking you to help us make it all work. **We want to be a positive addition to our neighborhood, so please drive with caution and be courteous to our neighbors!**

HERE IS SOME IMPORTANT INFORMATION...

1. We would prefer that students are dropped off at our campus and picked up directly from our campus.
2. There is an option for students to be bussed to our campus from the Brea/Yorba Linda area and/or Whittier Christian High School in the morning. There is a fee for this service (see next page). If you want your student to be shuttled from the Brea area, they will need to be at Rose Drive Friends Church before 7:10 am. The students will go from there to Whittier Christian High School where more students will be picked up. If you want to ride the bus from Whittier Christian High School, they will have to be at the high school student parking lot (Beach Blvd. side) between 7:20 am and 7:35 am. The bus will not wait after 7:35 am! The bus will then continue on to our campus. WE DO NOT PROVIDE SUPERVISION FOR STUDENTS AT EITHER OF THESE SITES.

3. After school our students can be picked up from the campus, and some (who have paid for the service) will be bussed back to Whittier Christian High School to be picked up. Students picked up at the high school must be picked up between 3:20 pm and 3:40 pm. The bus will then continue to the Brea Olinda Friends Christian School campus and students MUST be picked up at the Brea Olinda campus before 4:15 pm.
4. After school daycare will be held at our campus until 6:00 pm.
5. If your student is involved in after school sports, you will be given specific instructions by the Athletic Department.

SHUTTLE BUS CHARGES:

1. If your student takes the "Short Shuttle" either to or from Whittier Christian High School, there will be a charge of \$150 for the year.
2. If your student takes the "Long Shuttle" either to or from the Brea area, there will be a charge of \$250 for the year.
3. We are only supplying one bus for these shuttles and therefore we have a limit of 60 students for the combination of these shuttle services. **YOUR PAYMENT WILL RESERVE YOU A SPOT AND IT WILL BE DONE ON A FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED BASIS.**
4. Please call the school office if you have any questions.
5. There will be a "Shuttle Bus Information" form to be filled out (in this registration packet).

Magazine Drive:

Save your subscriptions!!! Yes, we will be having a Magazine Sale starting on Wednesday, September 9 and finishing on Thursday, September 24. Please check with your relatives and friends and ask them to save their renewals for this event!

Hot Lunch Program:

We will be offering a Hot Lunch Program at HCJH this coming school year! There will be two options for food... 1) A Pre-Ordered Plan in which you can choose the meals you want on a daily basis, and 2) An A La Carte Menu in which you can order something individually each day. See the information sheet in this packet.

Financial Information:

Here is some important information about your monthly payments and other pertinent financial information...

- **Registration Payment:** A registration fee of \$395.00 was due upon enrollment to the school. The fully paid registration fee is your only assurance of a place at HCJH. Please call the school office if you have any questions. This fee is non-refundable.
- **Tuition:** Payments are to be made to the Junior High School office. First payment is due August 1st.
- **Late Fees and Past Due Accounts:** Tuition payments are **due on the first of each month** and a late fee of \$25.00 will be charged for payments that come in **after the 5th of each month**. There will be a \$40.00 charge for any returned check. Note: After two checks have been returned, all fees must be paid in cash (including tuition). **There is a 5% discount for full-year payment made up front.**
- **Day Care:** Day care will be offered on campus before school (6:45 am – 7:15 am) and after school (3:30 pm – 6:00 pm). Day care fees will be charged according to the following scale:

Morning Day Care:	
*6:45 am – 7:15 am arrival	\$5.00 per use (up to 10 occasions per month) \$30.00 flat charge if used more than 10 occasions per month.
After School Day Care:	
*3:30 pm – 6:00 pm	\$5.00 per hour (up to 10 hours per month) \$75.00 flat charge if used more than 10 occasions per month.

- **Elective Classes:** Some of our Elective Classes will have a fee. These fees are to pay for materials and will be collected once the class has started. Check the Elective Class List to see which classes have fees assigned. The fees are usually no more than \$20.00.
- **Student Organizer:** We will be incorporating an Assignment Organizer into our program to help our students keep their school lives in order. This book will help them with assignments, projects and communication with the home. There will be a \$15.00 charge for this book that will be paid at Registration Day.
- **PE Uniforms:** This uniform includes a pair of shorts and a PE shirt. The charge for the set is \$25.00 (due at Registration).
- **Music Fee:** There will be a charge of \$125.00 per student to participate in any aspect of the Music Department (Band, Jazzband, Choir, Praise Dancers and/or Handbells). This is a one-time fee, which will help cover costs to run the program.
- **Athletic Fee:** There will be a charge of \$100.00 per student per sport. This fee will help to cover costs to run the individual sport.

School Pictures: On Wednesday, September 16, we will be setting up for the Student Pictures on campus. There are a variety of picture packets available for purchase. We need ALL students to be present that day. It is during this day that student's pictures are taken for their I.D. cards. If they miss this day there is no I.D. card.

Our "Success Program": The purpose of this program is to provide academic assistance and remediation to students with diagnosed learning disabilities. The program will include three points of interaction between the learning coach and the identified student: 1) Regularly scheduled individualized sessions during the academic periods in the morning, 2) A sixth period study hall and 3) E-mail correspondence with our Learning Coach.

ELIGIBILITY FOR THE SUCCESS PROGRAM: The student must have, in our opinion, professionally diagnosed learning disabilities or be referred by HCJH staff. Local public school districts provide full diagnostic evaluations that include academic assessment, speech and language assessment, psychological assessment and physical assessment. Students completing a full evaluation by a school district will receive preferred enrollment. **Fees will be attached to our Success Program as follows:**

1. \$100 per month for full program (all three interactions listed above).
2. \$50 per month for the daily Specialized Study Halls and "as-needed" afternoon appointments.
3. \$25 per month for the e-mail correspondence.

Have your plans changed? If you have changed your plans about attending HCJH this coming year, please give the office a call immediately and let us know.

This is one class where you can even eat your projects!!! **There is an \$18.00 fee for materials used (and eaten).**

Beginning Handbells

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The use of the Internet must be in support of education and academic research and consistent with the educational objectives of Heights Christian Junior High. **HCJH has an internet filter that restricts inappropriate sites from student viewing, however the student must be diligent in not attempting to access inappropriate information intentionally.**

- Access and exploration of appropriate information and resources as it relates to research topics being studied in school.

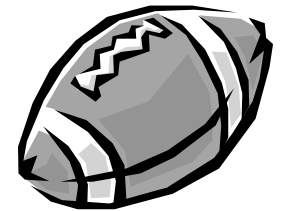

DRESS CODE – 2009/2010

Dress standards reflect the quality of the school as well as the conduct and attitudes of the students. There are definite relationships between dress habits, work habits and school behavior. Just as adults dress for professional success, we must expect our students to dress for academic success. All students are expected to be dressed modestly and groomed neatly.

GENERAL DRESS STATEMENTS:

- 1) **All shorts MUST be “uniform style” shorts.** These shorts can be purchased from the “uniform section” of department stores such as Penney’s, Target, Sears, Wal-Mart or Nordstrom’s. You might also find them in other retail stores. **Uniform style means any thick/sturdy, cotton or cotton-blend fabric, approximately knee length, and having conventional belt loops. There are to be no extra pockets on the legs of the shorts (with the exception of small cell phone pockets). “Cargo Shorts” will not be permitted.**
- 2) Shirts with sleeves must be worn at all times. **T-Shirts are acceptable. Sheer fabrics or underwear-type T-shirts of any kind are not allowed.** Sweatshirts with appropriate logos are acceptable. **Words or pictures** on shirts or sweatshirts are acceptable as long as they have “appropriate” messages. Music Group shirts or sweatshirts are not to be worn. Clothing worn under shirts should be neat and color coordinated. Thermal underwear is not appropriate for an outer garment.
- 3) Clothing that might represent a violent lifestyle, such as military clothing or “heavy metal”, is not acceptable. No gang-affiliated attire of any kind may be worn. No “skeleton or skull” pictures will be allowed.
- 4) No **oversized” or “tight-fitting”** pants, shorts or shirts will be permitted. All pants and shorts are to be worn at waist height at all times (no “sagging”). Pants and shorts should be neat and clean without being frayed or ragged. Sweat pants, warm ups or jogging outfits are unacceptable.
- 5) Hair is to be the natural color of the individual student (and should not be tinted beyond what looks natural). If hair coloring is deemed inappropriate by the administration, the student will be asked to have it fixed. Students are not to write or draw on any part of their bodies or clothing, and tattoos of short or long duration are not permitted.
- 6) Sun protective clothing and sunglasses are acceptable if worn in a proper manner. These items are never to be worn inside any room. **Baseball hats MUST be HCJH hats (no others will be allowed).** Hats must be worn properly. The bill of the cap should be straight ahead (never crooked or backwards). The HCJH hats can be purchased from the school office. See the office staff for more details.
- 7) Appropriate shoes and socks are to be worn at all times. No open sandals, high heeled shoes, platform shoes or boots are to be worn. All heels should not exceed one inch. Comfortable tennis shoes are the shoes of preference. All shoes must be tied or fastened properly (not loose and floppy).
- 8) Body piercing is not permitted, with the exception of two earrings per ear (for girls only).
- 9) After a first offense of wearing clothing that is contrary to the dress code, the student may be restricted from wearing certain items in the future (such as skirts). Students will also be asked to wear their P.E. clothes (or office clothing) as replacement clothing for that which is inappropriate.
- 10) If a student is “not sure” if something they want to wear is appropriate or not, it would be advisable to bring it in to the office to check before wearing it.
- 11) The school administration will have the final word as to appropriate dress.

GIRLS:

- 1) Modest dresses, pants, skirts or uniform shorts are the usual attire. Jeans and capri pants are also acceptable. Uniform style "skorts" are acceptable, but must be loose fitting and must follow the "length standard". All skirts, dresses, or shorts should be no shorter than 4 inches above the knee. All front, back or side slits on skirts or dresses need to meet the same four-inch requirement. This can be measured while kneeling on a hard surface and looking at the distance from the floor to the material. No "fishnet stockings".
- 2) Ultra low pants and bare midriff shirts are not acceptable. No low-cut tops are to be worn. Girls' tops must have sleeves. Shirts must cover the top of the pants or skirts. **SHIRTS OR TOPS MUST NOT BE SEE-THROUGH.**
- 3) Excessive make up, long dangling earrings (such as hoops larger than a nickel) and more than two earrings in each ear is not permitted. Girls are expected to wear undergarments at all times. Expensive jewelry should be left at home. No aerosol hair spray on campus.

BOYS:

- 1) Neat pants, jeans, cords and uniform style shorts with sleeved shirts or sweatshirts are the usual attire.
- 2) If an "undershirt" is worn, it needs to be tucked in so that it does not show if the outer shirt is untucked.
- 3) Neat haircuts are in order, with the hairline coming above the collar of the shirt and neatly trimmed. Hair should not have drastic differences in length and should not hang in the eyes or completely cover the ears. Please do not cut the hair any closer to the skin than a number 2.
- 4) Wallet chains and dangling belts are not appropriate at school.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS:

GUM:

*Gum is NEVER allowed **on campus** (unless an exception is made by the administration... for a special "fun" day). This includes before school, at break, at lunch, and after school. No gum will be chewed on the bus as well, or on school-related field trips.*

HCJH ELECTRONICS POLICIES:

Electronic devices are not allowed on campus, on the bus, at bus stops or at school events. *This would include items such as CD players, I-Pods (or other music or recording devices) and cameras. Electronic devices should not be used on the bus as well. Any electronic devices that are used improperly will be confiscated and held in the office for a parent to pick up.*

Cell phones *should not be used AT ALL between 8:00 am and 3:00 pm. Cell phones should be OFF and INVISIBLE during the school day.*

Any cell phones that are used improperly will be confiscated and held in the office for a parent to pick up.

NOTE POLICY:

Students at HCJH are not allowed to write, read or pass notes on campus.

HCJHS COMPUTER LAB POLICIES:

Playing Computer Games in the computer lab before school, during any class, at break or lunch, or after school is prohibited.

Food & Drink (including water) is NEVER allowed in the computer lab. Any food, drink, and/or water must be thrown away before entering the computer lab. Nothing should be left on the counter or floor inside the computer lab door.

Violation of these policies will result in a referral.

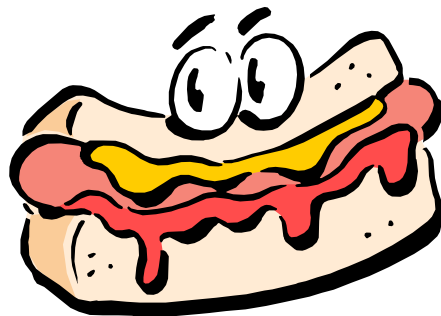

Each student must begin school with the following items:

1. One **large three-ring binder** (three inch rings or larger)...
***OR** three **smaller three-ring binders** (one inch rings). *Your choice based upon which you think would work better for your student. One binder would hold ALL classes, and three binders would divide up the classes (early morning, late morning and afternoon). **THOSE STUDENTS WHO STRUGGLE WITH ORGANIZATION SHOULD GO WITH THE "ONE BINDER SYSTEM"**.
2. Supply of **college lined notebook paper**
3. Small supply of **graph paper** (four or five squares to the inch)
4. Eight **notebook dividers** (dividers with pockets are helpful!)
Label a divider for each of the following: Bible, Math, Science, History, English, Mini Course, Elective, Paper
5. **Colored pencils** (set of six suggested)
6. **Mechanical pencils** and **#2 pencils** (two or three of each suggested)
7. Several black, blue and red **ball point pens**
8. Three **highlighters** (different colors)
9. New International Version **Bible**
10. **Pencil pouch** for the binder(s)
11. Five or six plain **3-brad folders** WITH POCKETS (report folders with metal clasps)
12. A **gym bag** for PE clothes to be kept in the PE locker room (can be purchased from HCJH)
13. Two **spiral bound college-ruled notebooks**, 3-hole punched (approximately 150 pages)
14. Three **composition books**
15. One **spiral bound set of index cards (4 x 6)** *please make sure it is lined

The following required items are paid for at registration and issued to students after school begins:

16. **Student organizer** - \$15.00 paid on Registration Day (We will issue the student organizer during the first week of school.)
17. **Solar scientific calculator** (for 8th graders only) - \$16.00 paid on Registration Day (We teach the 8th grade students how to use the two line calculator in preparation for high school so they all need the exact same calculator. We will issue the calculators to the 8th grade students after school begins. Also, the school gets a good price on the bulk order.)
18. One set of **PE clothes** - \$25.00 paid on Registration Day (Each student must have at least one set of HCJH PE clothes. Returning students may use their PE clothes from the previous year or you may obtain a set from an older sibling. We prefer the PE clothes to fit comfortably; a larger fit is better than a smaller fit. We will issue new PE clothes during the second week of school.)
19. **English class novels** - \$9.00 paid on Registration Day (Each student will be issued personal copies of two selected novels for use in English class. We will issue the books so that all of the books are exactly the same.)

Optional Spirit Wear items may be purchased on Registration Day.

School sweatshirts, T-shirts, hats and gym bags are available for purchase on Registration Day. Prices range from \$15.00 to \$35.00. *School sweatshirts and T-shirts are only ordered once and must be purchased during registration.* Hats and gym bags are usually available for purchase during the school year.
